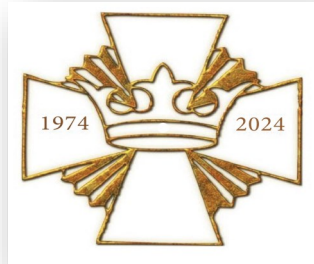

GOSPEL MEDITATION

The best way to understand the Eucharist is to recall God's long, careful teaching process beginning in the Old Testament. This week in Exodus 24, we learn the basic pattern. Moses reads the dictates of God's law to the people, who profess their allegiance to it. Then Moses takes representatives of Israel's twelve tribes and splashes the sacrificed blood of animals in two directions: on the altar and on the people. It's clear and serious business: clear, because the participants are entering a blood-bond with God Himself; serious, because the dead animals symbolize the life-and-death stakes at play.

Many centuries later, God uses the experience at Sinai to teach us something new. At the Last Supper, like a new Moses, Jesus proposes to "pour out" blood as a new covenant. It will land on the altar of the cross and the lips of his disciples. They have promised to be obedient to him who is God's law in flesh. This renews and elevates the breath-taking romance God wants with His people, unfolding from Sinai to this Supper. The Body and Blood of Christ is the sacrificial action whereby this covenant is strengthened.

How hopeful that, like us, the Israelites and the apostles repeatedly fail to live up to their promises and discover that the blood of the covenant continually renews and refreshes them. Today the blood of Christ faithfully flows, to unite and renew, moving us forward toward where our great teacher is taking us. This week, we should say a renewed "amen" to God who so carefully teaches us how to be one with Him in this new covenant.

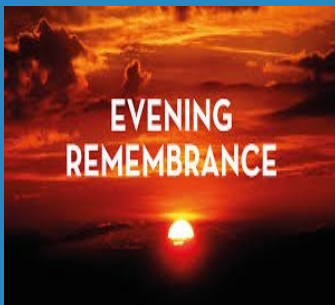

NATIONAL SHRINE OF ST. FRANCIS

Visit the **National Shrine of St. Francis** in North Beach at 610 Vallejo St., San Francisco. Mass is celebrated Tuesday-Saturday at 12:15 pm and on Sunday at 11:00 am. You can also visit **La Porziuncola Nuova**, a scaled replica of Saint Francis's Porziuncola in Assisi, Italy, dedicated in San Francisco on September 27, 2008 by Cardinal William J. Levada, Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith. Porziuncola means "small portion of land" and refers to the Benedictine chapel Saint Francis restored when he was a young man. For only the fifth time in Church/Papal History, a declaration was made by his Holiness Pope Benedict XVI naming The National Shrine and Porziuncola a Holy Site. Tours of the St. Francis’ Assisi Portiuncola replica are Wednesday-Saturday from 10 am—4 pm and on Sunday from 12 pm—2 pm. For additional information, please visit the website at www.shrinesf.org.

MASS INTENTIONS FOR 2025

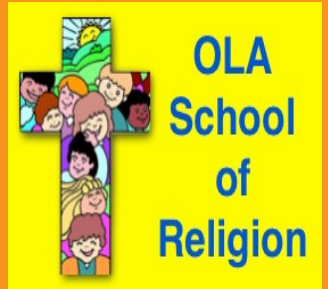

SCHOOL OF RELIGION REGISTRATION FOR K-6

Early registration runs from April 1—June 15
\$175 tuition per child if received before June 15 (\$225 after June 15)
A \$50 fee for Second Year (Grade 2) Sacramental Students for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist is required. K-6 classes are Wednesdays from 4pm—5:15pm from October through May. We also offer a homeschool program. Forms can be found online at ola.community under *School of Religion*, then click on *Enrollment*. Late registration applications will be notified in August if there is still space in the in-person classes. Those on the waitlist would be welcomed into the homeschool program if in-person classes are full.
